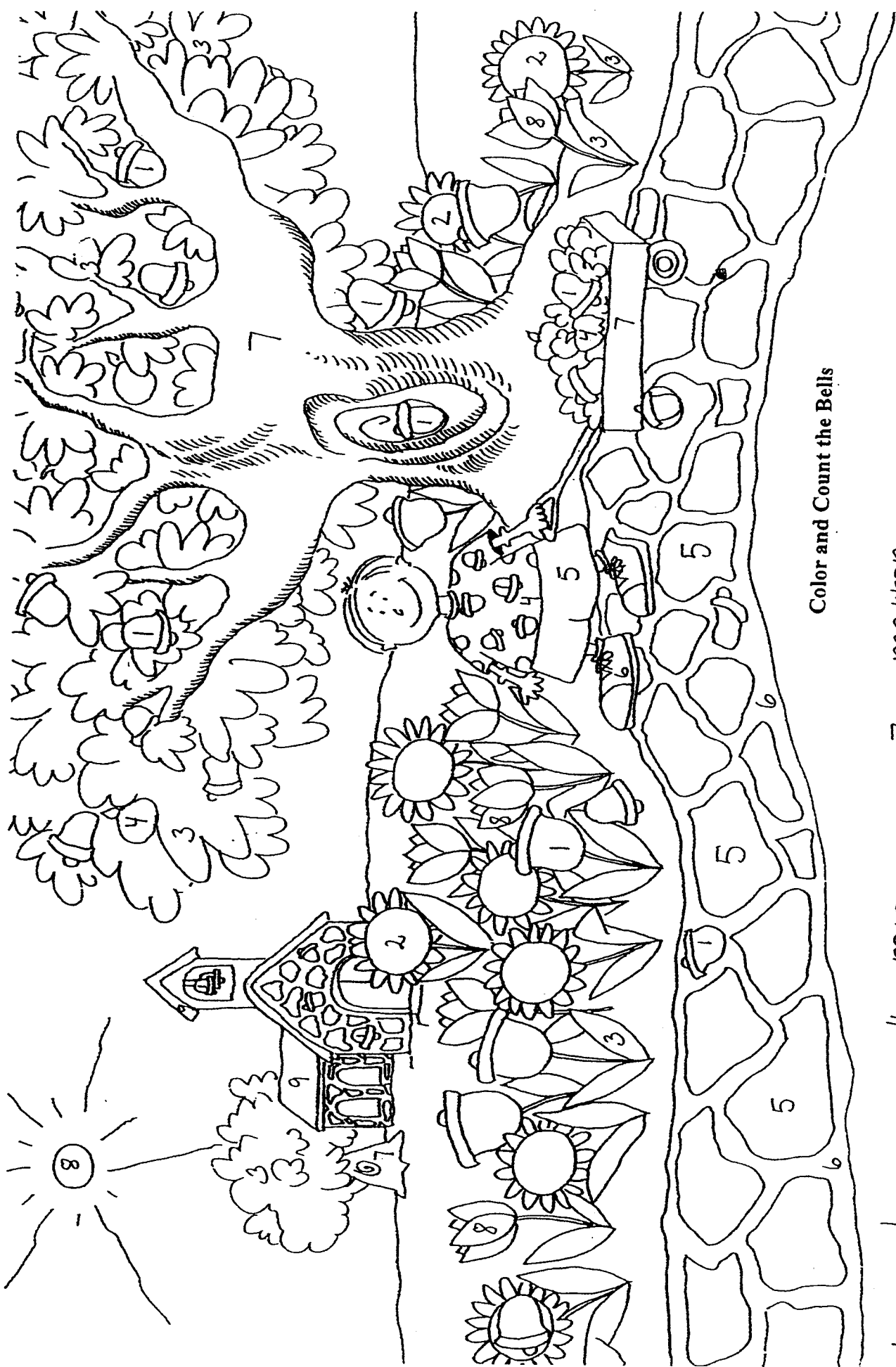
Also, make sure you practice your Spanish vocabulary a little bit each day. Tell your parents what clothes you're wearing and their colors, tell them the day of the week and date, point out foods at the grocery store or at mealtimes, etc. (Your parents will be so impressed and you'll have fun reviewing too!) Incorporate Spanish in your daily life. You'll be so happy you did when your teacher asks if you've been practicing and you get to answer "YES!" and show off your skills ☺

## Table of Contents

- 1: Color in the picture with the color that corresponds to the number. Count the bells.
- 2: Review the numbers 0 -29. Play Bingo. Make your own bingo cards and keep practicing the numbers.
- 3: Review the summer weather. Look at the pictures and combine with the appropriate weather expressions. Try to use these expressions everyday when talking about the weather in Spanish. Where do you go in the summer? Look at the pictures and find the right sentences below. Write the number of the appropriate sentence next to the picture. ☺
- 4-5: Read "Tengo Hambre, Tengo Sed" and replace the pictures with the right vocabulary. Practice saying phrases like "I'm hungry," "I'm thirsty," and "I'm Tired" in Spanish (dictionary on the second page of the story).
- 6: Practice "House" vocabulary! Draw several houses and name all the rooms. Glue all the houses on a poster. Draw a street and children playing in the park. Tell the story about: "Life in the neighborhood." Play the board game - see the rules below. Ask: "Where are you". Answer: "I am in the ....."
- 7: Review beginning dialogue questions. Match the right questions with the right answers. Read the "stories" about José. Tell your own "story" and tell the "story" of everybody in your family, even your stuffed animals. Write your stories down and bring your stories to class in September to show to your teacher.

**Board Game Rules:** You'll need a die and a game piece by which each player or team may move around the board. Player is to roll the die and advance through the game trying to get to the finish (La Salida) before the other player or players. Starting point is "La Entrada." If a player lands on a space that is already occupied by another player, the player originally occupying the space must go back two spaces. (In other words, he gets bumped back!) If a player lands on a space with an arrow, he/she must follow it whether it advances the player or puts him/her back and must *also* do the activity for both spaces on either side of the arrow. Whoever arrives at the end first wins! However, the player must roll the EXACT number to get to the finish.

That's all! Have fun practicing over the summer and we wait to see you back next fall in Spanish class! Hasta Luego! ☺
